Dress Rehearsal

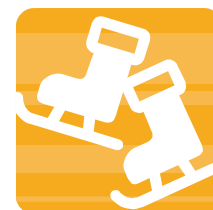

Tickets for the Ice Show are \$6.00 for all on-ice seats, \$5.00 lobby, \$3.00 for 12 and under and free for preschoolers in lobby. On ice seating is assigned at the time of ticket purchase. Tickets will be available March 13 and can be purchased from Mandy McFall.

On-ice seating provides a great view and atmosphere for the ice show. If you have not

attended the Clavet Skating Club Ice Show before and will be purchasing on-ice seats, please dress warmly as it does get quite chilly after sitting on-ice for a couple of hours. You will want to have warm footwear, gloves, etc. You will also benefit greatly from warm sleeping bags and blankets to sit on and to cover up with.
